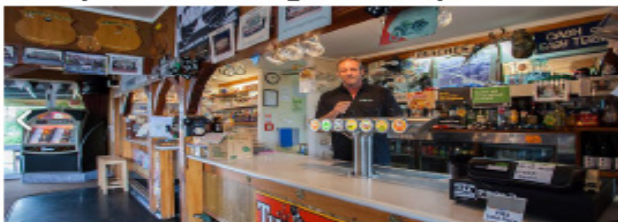

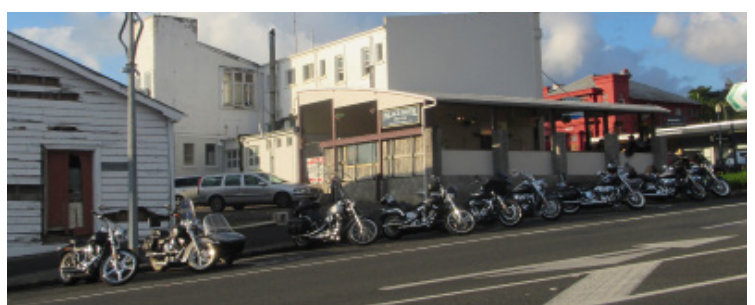
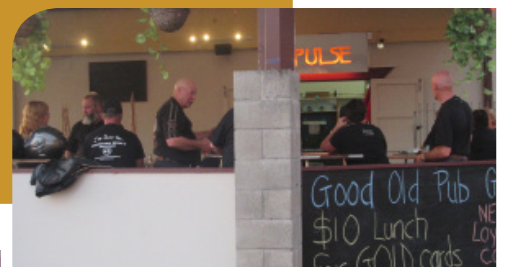
## *Te Aroha - Wednesday 3rd February 2016*
